How does Quash work?

Tui Quash is a bran-based pellet that contains Iron EDTA Complex which is rated less toxic than salt for humans and animals, yet is a potent stomach poison for slugs and snails.

Slugs and snails find Quash highly attractive and consume the pellets in preference to nearby plants. Once they've eaten, they lose their appetites and head off home to die – quickly and without a trace. Shells are seldom found after treatment with Quash.



Tui Quash is different to other slug and snail baits as it is not based on metaldehyde or methiobarb chemicals. These can cause fatal illness in pets, birds and wildlife when ingested, and can even damage animals that eat a slug or snail poisoned with it. This is known as secondary poisoning.

Use Quash to protect your garden, pets, wildlife and children with confidence.



Using Quash

Apply around seedlings, potted plants, vegetables and perennials.

Sprinkle pellets evenly around plants at a rate of one teaspoon per square metre.
